Big News for Western Juniper

Western juniper trees are a familiar sight in central and eastern Oregon. And while the species is native to the inter-mountain West, the area covered by juniper has expanded dramatically in the past century. Along with this expansion has come degradation of rangeland and loss of wildlife habitat in some areas. There is widespread agreement that juniper woodlands need to be treated/thinned. However, this is a costly endeavor in the absence of commercial markets for juniper products. At the same time, developing markets for juniper is challenging due in part to high harvest costs and low lumber yields. To further complicate market development efforts, there are no published data on lumber grades and engineering design values for the species. Therefore, engineers and architects wanting to specify juniper in a building project (e.g., beams or columns for a structure) often are forced to specify other wood species for which technical data are available. Well this limitation is soon to be removed. Thanks to the efforts of Sustainable Northwest, USDA Rural Business Development, Business Oregon, and the Oregon Department of Transportation, we are pursuing a project to develop engineering design values and lumber grades for western juniper.
